# 1. Rink start-up and Community Centre

# 2. Financial Report

Financials are on track and we maintain a healthy budget. The City Centre fund has been reduced significantly with the purchase of lights and rekeying of the community centre. The rekeying was needed and the lights have been appreciated by the community. We would want not want to see this fund fully depleted.

MCA has been approached for a donation of \$50 towards cookies and hot chocolate for a community caroling night. Approved.

Web fees have been paid and will need to be reimbursed. Henry will get receipts to Shaun.

The fall scavenger hunt was a success. There was good turn out and a great after event at Danby's. Unsure whether this will be run again as it was privately organized.

#### 3. MES status

A lot of comments have gone in to the school board from parents and community members. Jessica directly approached people with younger children to encourage that they voice opinions. A resident privately printed flyers to spread throughout the community reminding people to speak up. The next school board meeting is January 20. Residents should be encouraged to attend to continue to show support.

# 4. Winter carnival

The school has indicated they are not interested in or able to run the winter carnival this year. As it is felt this is an important community event, the MCA will look at taking it back. Jessica is to inquire with the school council as to whether any individuals would work with MCA to plan and organize the event. She will also ask the school if they would host a dance on the Friday night. Jessica is also to ask Deb about the date for the snowmobile weekend so we don't conflict again. Potential for the carnival would be Feb6/7 weekend at this point. Further discussion will have to be done via email as the next MCA meeting will be too late.

# 5. Children's furniture

The prices previously approved and taken from the supplier website are apparently out of date. The tables are now \$280 each and the chairs have gone up \$1 each. The total price taxes and deliver in will be about \$100 higher than the \$2,000 approved. Decision made to go ahead and order four tables and 16 chairs at the higher price. Discussion of colours and what was in stock and not.... Decided to order blue tables and chairs and to order them rather than playing for delivery on a partial order and then a final shipment.

# 6. New business

A thank you card was received from Munster United thanking the MCA for naming the church one of the charities to received proceeds of garden tour. They noted it was a pleasure working with Lynn and being part of the event, which was a great success.
